

Your Grace Liturgical Team meets weekly to review, plan and develop all the details that go into our worship services. This Lent, we are shortening the bulletin (per your suggestion) to save paper by resuming the old-school practice of using the Hymnal (as needed). We will be trying out two separate bulletins for the 8am and 10am services. The same announcements will be in both leaflets. Just by doing this we are saving approximately 12,650 pieces of paper a year. We also are returning to our pre-pandemic practice of not printing the Prayers of the People, but the names that we hold in Prayer will remain in the bulletin and will be listed in a new order (not alphabetically but listed as they are added). We also have an online form for submitting prayers now. And lastly, during Lent it is also our practice to use incense at the 10am service, during the Triduum, and then on Easter Day. As always, we appreciate your ideas and welcome your feedback.


