

The Episcopal Church rolled out a new curriculum in 2022, which is now called **Safe Church, Safe Communities**. In order to be consistent with the policies of The Episcopal Church, **Safe Church** training now needs to be renewed every three years. Praesidium is the platform that hosts the Safe Church training, and it is recommended that it be renewed every year and will automatically send notices for renewal. Those notices can be ignored until your 3-year renewal is due.


