Most important is the food we provide. Food with protein:

- Chicken or Tuna salad boxes
- Fruit cups
- 100% juice (juice boxes or cans preferred)
- Granola bars
- Pudding cups
- individual packets of nuts, raisins, cheese and cracker packets, and small packets of cookies.
- Ready-to-eat pop-top soup cans

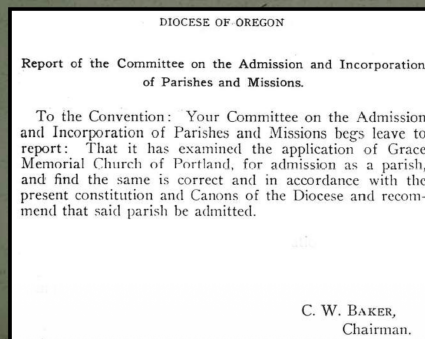

Grace History: A Look Back in Time!

Women's Guild and Grace Approved!

- 1910 - Women's Guild Formed
